

## 1. General description

Planar passivated high commutation three quadrant triac in a TO263 (D<sup>2</sup>PAK) surface mountable plastic package intended for use in circuits where high static and dynamic dV/dt and high dI<sub>T</sub>/dt can occur. This triac will commutate the full RMS current at the maximum rated junction temperature ( $T_{j(max)} = 150^\circ\text{C}$ ) without the aid of a snubber. It is used in applications where high junction operating temperature capability is required.








**Fig. 1. RMS on-state current as a function of mounting base temperature; maximum values**





**Fig. 2. RMS on-state current as a function of surge duration; maximum values**









Fig. 6. Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse duration

Fig. 7. Normalized gate trigger current as a function of junction temperature




Fig. 8. Normalized latching current as a function of junction temperature





Fig. 9. Normalized holding current as a function of junction temperature

Fig. 10. On-state current as a function of on-state voltage






Fig. 11. Normalized gate trigger voltage as a function of junction temperature
