

Product Overview

The APTGX75A170T3AG device is a phase leg 1700V, 75A Insulated-Gate Bipolar Transistor (IGBT) 7 power module.

Figure 1. Electrical Diagram

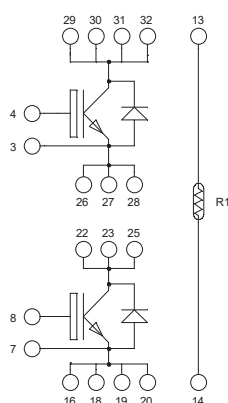
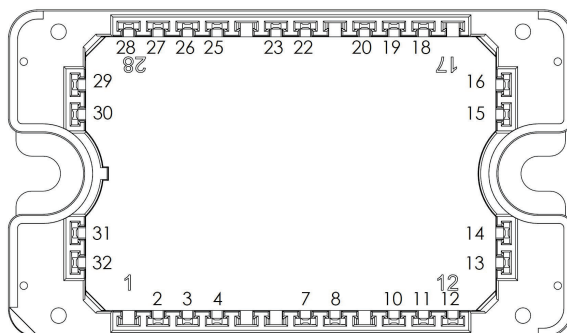


Figure 2. Pinout Location

Figure 1-1. Maximum Thermal Impedance

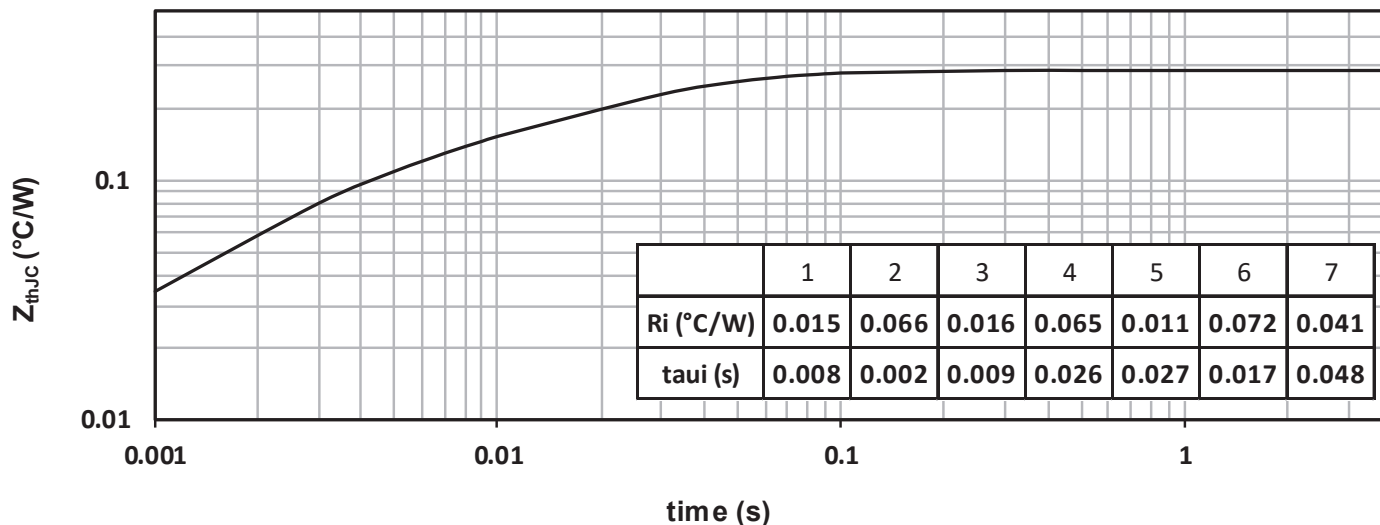


Figure 1-2. Output Characteristics, $V_{GE} = 15\text{V}$

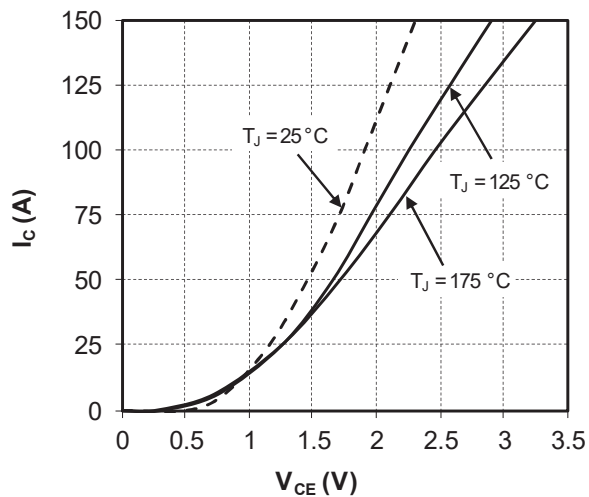


Figure 1-3. Output Characteristics, $T_J = 175^{\circ}\text{C}$

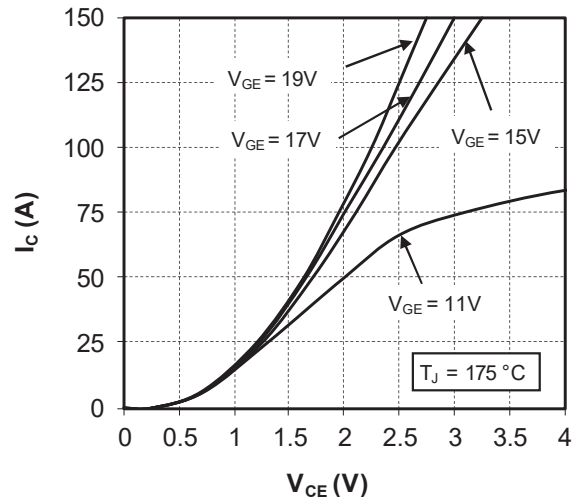


Figure 1-4. Switching Losses vs. Gate Resistance

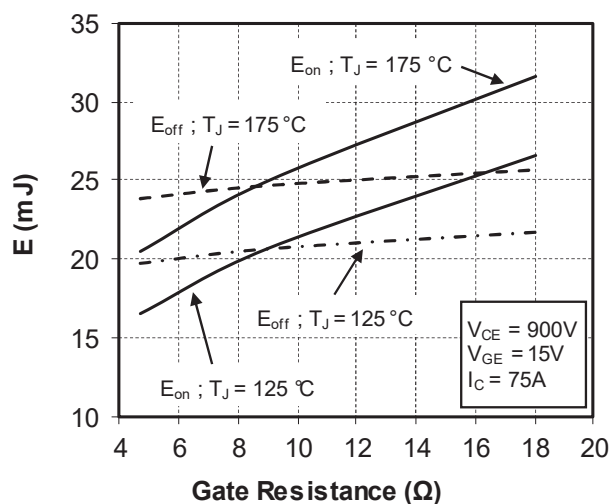


Figure 1-5. Switching Losses vs. Collector Current

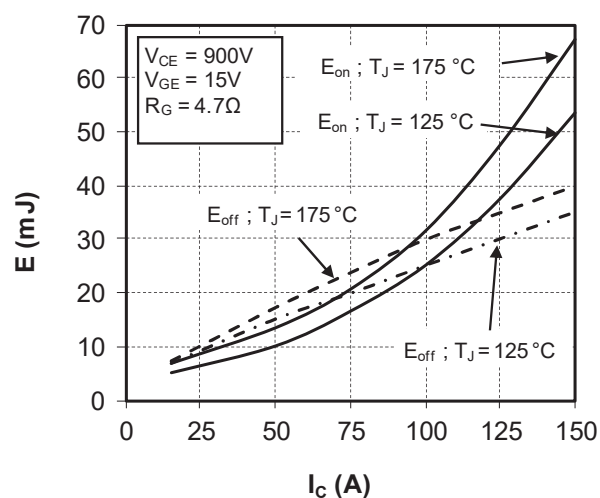


Figure 1-6. Operating Frequency vs. Collector Current

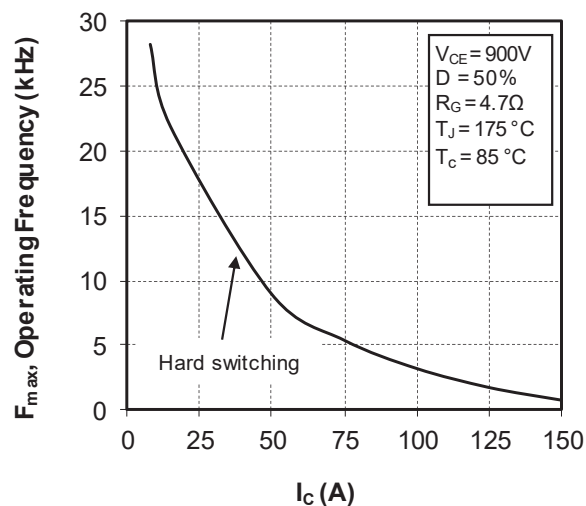


Figure 1-7. Gate Charge Characteristics

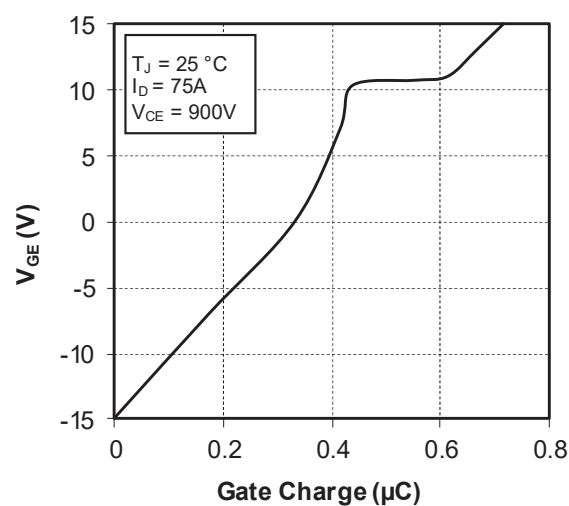


Figure 1-8. Transfer Characteristics

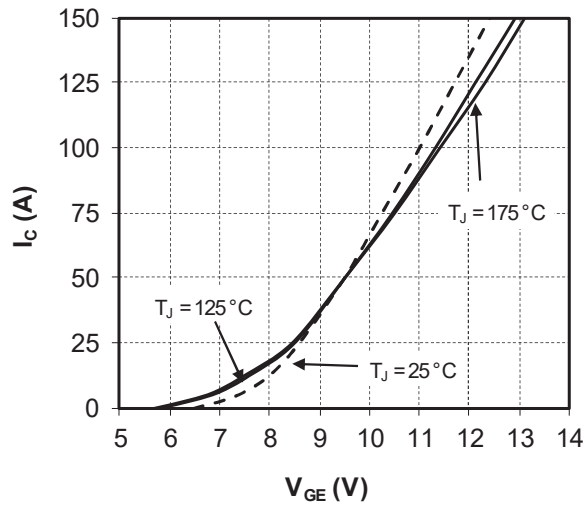


Figure 1-9. Capacity Characteristics

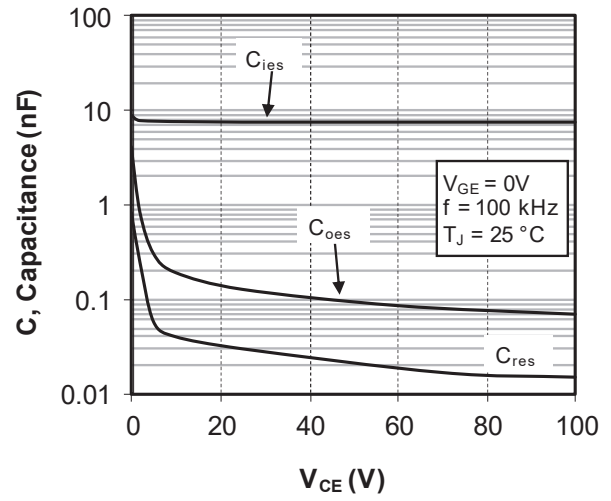
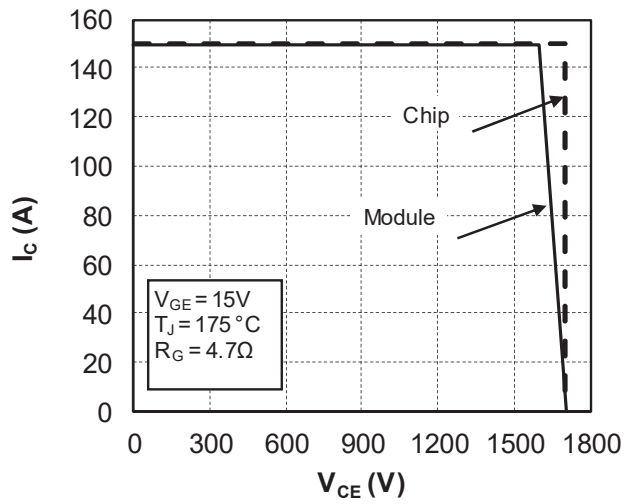


Figure 1-10. Reverse Bias Safe Operating Area

Figure 1-11. Maximum Thermal Impedance

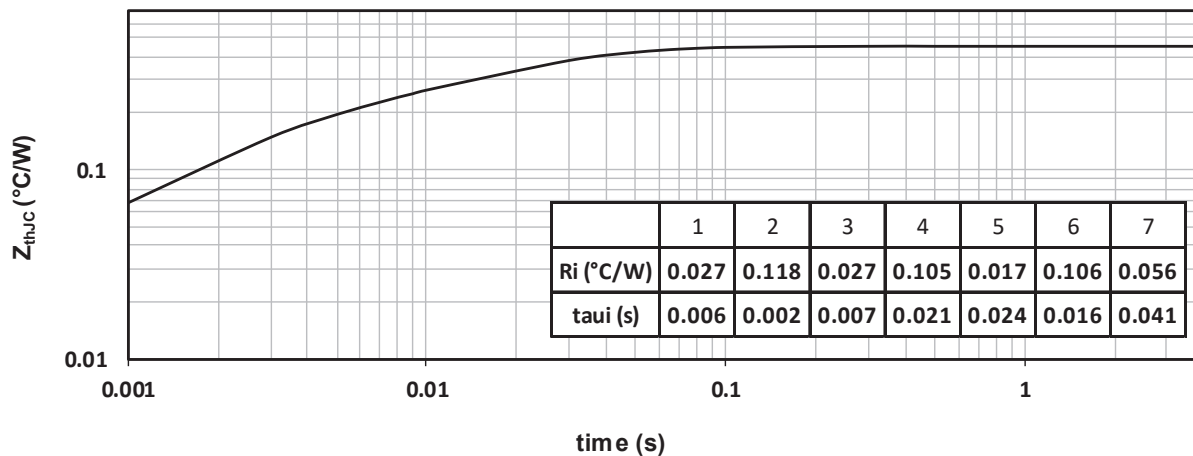


Figure 1-12. Forward Characteristics

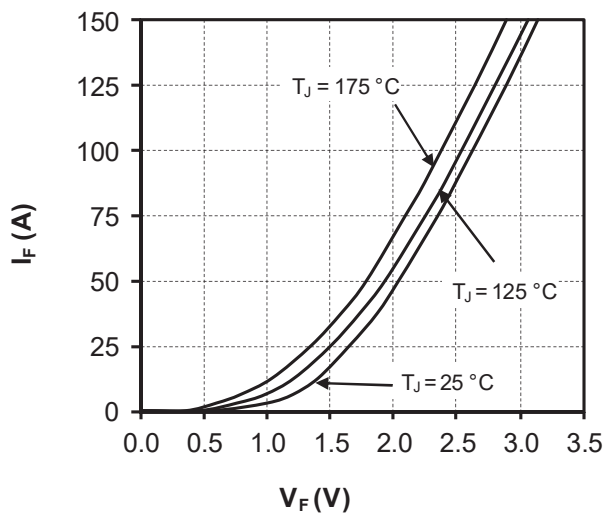


Figure 1-13. Switching Losses vs. Gate Resistance

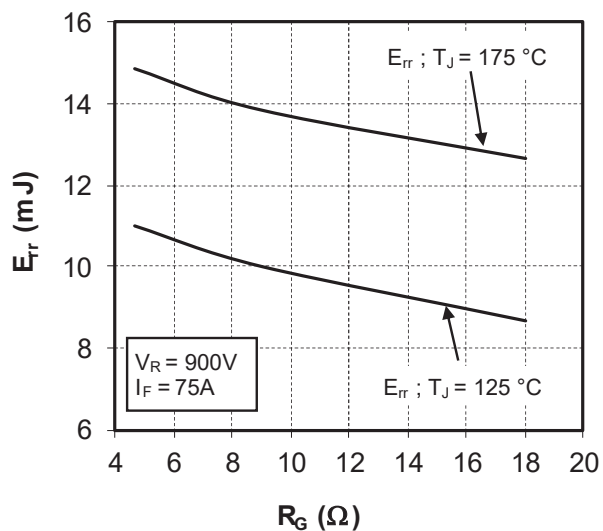
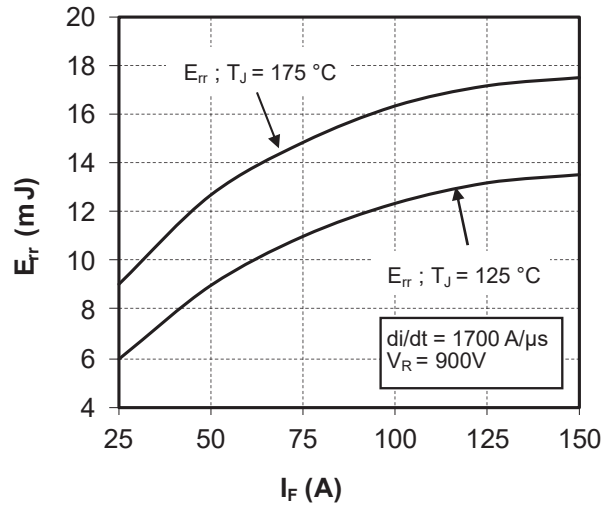


Figure 1-14. Switching Losses vs. Forward Current



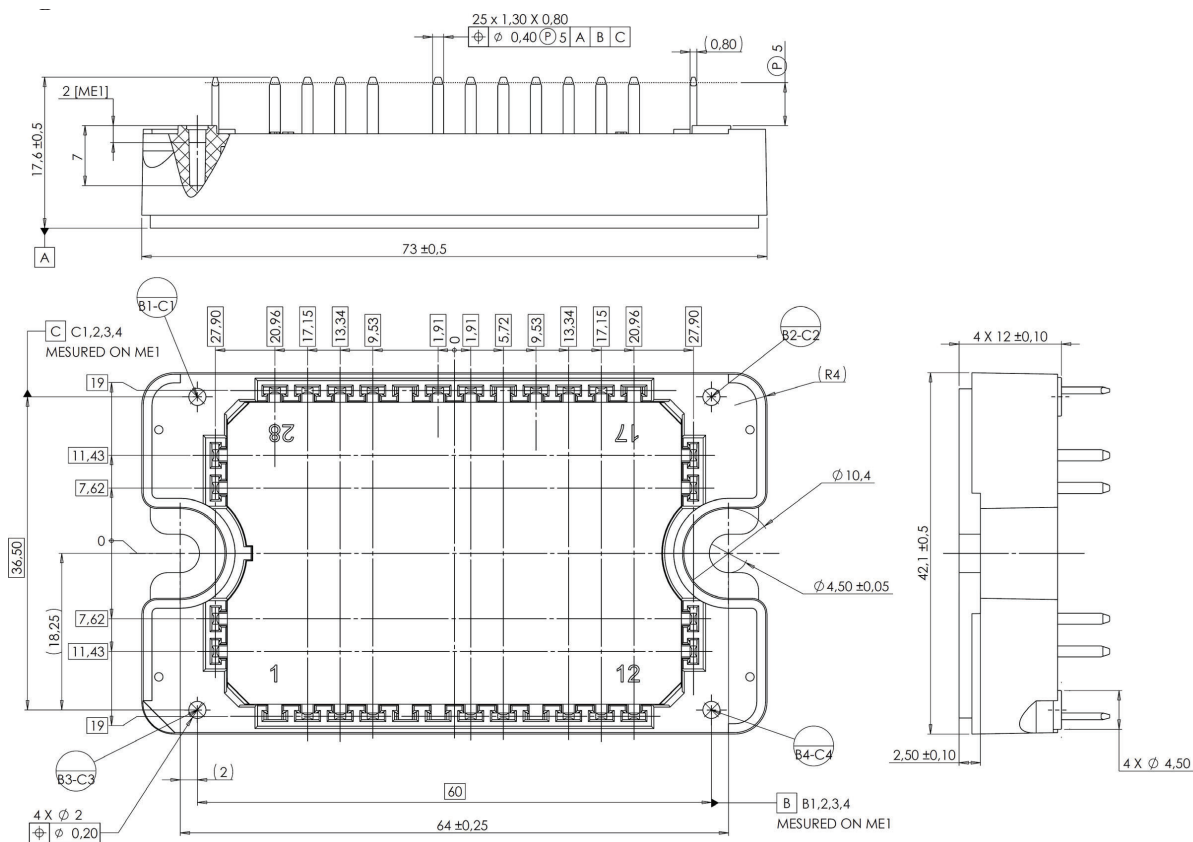
